Kingsbury Primary School is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of Kingsbury Primary School's voluntary financial contributions for 2023.



For 2023, School Council are suggesting a curriculum contribution of \$120 per student. To comply with recent changes to Department of Education policy, Kingsbury Primary School will not be charging extra for a "book pack". Extra-Curricular Items and Activities – provided on a user-pays basis

The cost of extra-curricular items and activities will be advised throughout the year. The below table provides an indication of extra-curriculum items and activities provided.

Financial Support for Families

Kingsbury Primary School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- The **Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund** which provides payments for eligible students to attend camps, sports and excursions.
- Access to **State Schools' Relief** support to assist with uniforms.
- Payment plans for Extra-Curricular Items and Activities.

Payment methods

Kingsbury Primary School's preferred method of payment is via the Compass parent portal. Where families choose not to use the Compass portal, they can make payment at the school office in person with our EFTPOS facilities.

Refunds

Parent requests for refunds are subject to the discretion of the school and made on a case-by-case basis. Refunds will be provided where the school deems it is reasonable and fair to do so, taking into consideration whether a cost has been incurred, the Department's Parent Payments Policy and Guidance, Financial Help for Families Policy, and any other relevant information.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
