2020 Student Placements

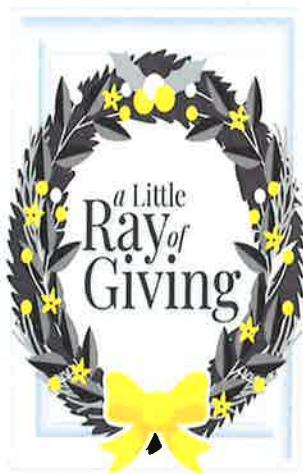

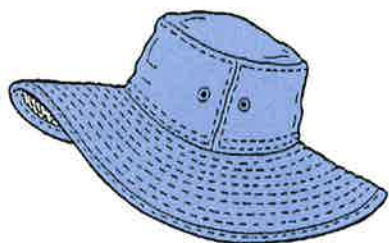
Our Junior Leader for this week is Rares for helping to contribute some fantastic ideas for our upcoming summer holiday program. Thanks and well done, Rares!
