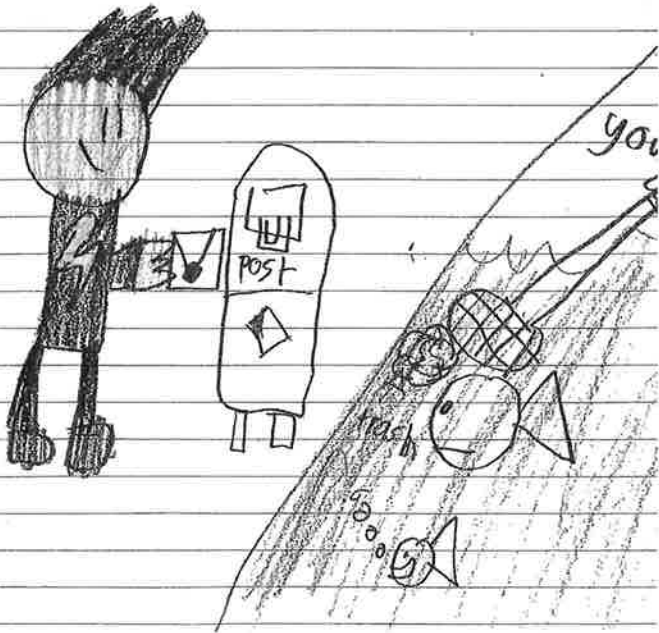

Good job for trying to save the environment. Unfortunately there are people in this world who use a lot of plastic!

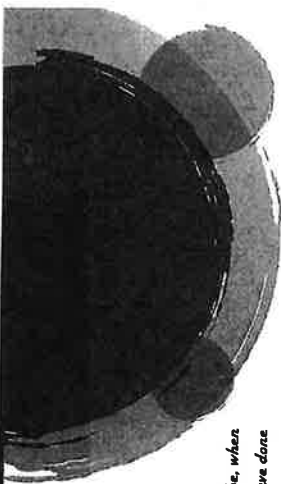


But I try to not use plastic but there are lots of plastic boards and plastic bins.

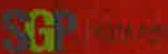
